- FAMLI ensures CO workers have access to paid leave to take care of themselves or their family during life circumstances that pull them away from their jobs. This leave may be taken continuously, intermittently, or in the form of a reduced work schedule. You may receive up to 12 weeks of leave per year for a variety of reasons, including the need to address the immediate safety needs and impact of domestic violence and/or sexual assault
